# REMEMBERING 1944

In June of this year there were major commemorations in the United Kingdom and in France to mark the 80th anniversary of D Day.

On 6th June 1944 Allied troops landed on five beaches in Normandy. It was the largest seaborne invasion in history and was the start of the Battle of Normandy which continued until the end of August.

During it the Allied forces suffered many casualties and thousands of French people were also killed.

Three police officers from our former forces made the ultimate sacrifice during the battle.

Constable Walter Bernard England of the Cardiff City Police, served with the Royal Armoured Corps, and was killed when his tank was hit on 17th July.

Alfred John Went was a Special Constable in the Glamorgan Police and was serving with 4th Battalion, Welch Regiment, when he suffered wounds from which he died on 25th July.

War Reserve Constable William Vincent Jones, also of the Glamorgan Police, was serving with 1st Battalion Welsh Guards, when he was killed in action on 4th August.

However, they were not the only ones to lose their lives during 1944. Away from Normandy another fifteen policemen-nine from Glamorgan and six from Cardiff-died during the year.

Whilst it is inevitable that we remember particularly those who died on active service we should not forget those who died in this country due to enemy action.

One of those was Constable Thomas George Griffiths of the Glamorgan Police and the Welsh Guards.

On 30th June, a sports event involving members of the regiment was taking place at the Metropolitan Police sports ground at Imber Court in Surrey.

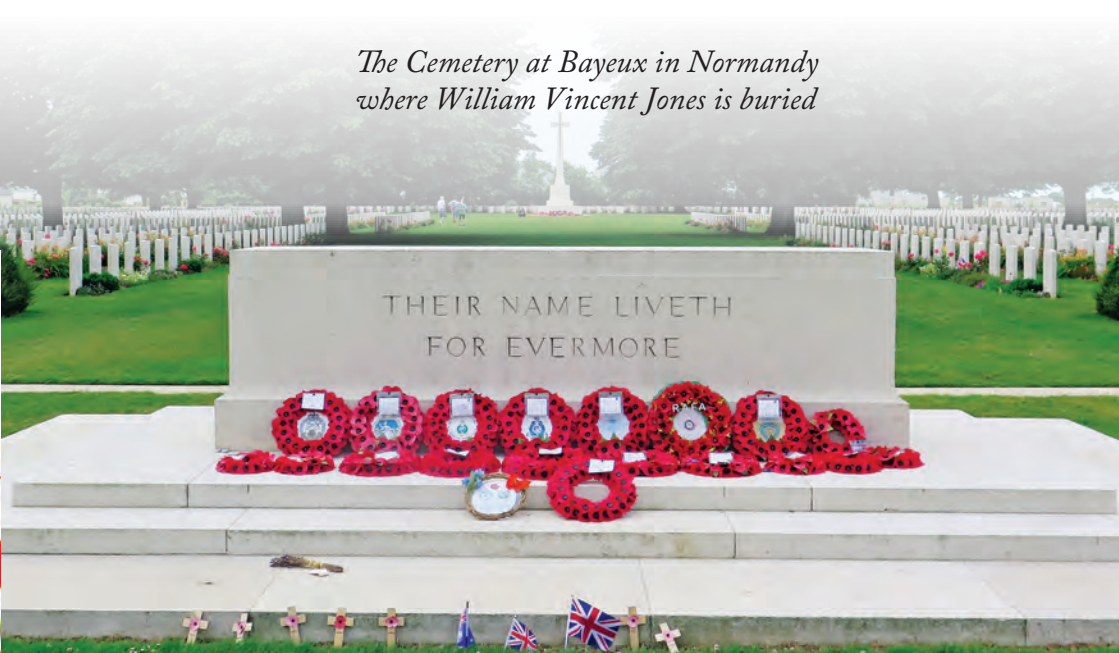
During the afternoon, a German V1 flying bomb descended on the crowd, killing and injuring many people.

Among them was Thomas who died of his wounds on 4th July.

This Armistice Day we remember him, and all those from our former forces who died.

They will never be forgotten.
