INTRODUCTION

Following on from our First World War project which remembered those police officers from our predecessor forces who made the ultimate sacrifice in that conflict, we have embarked on similar work in respect of the Second World War.

This booklet is the result of that research. It includes brief details of all those whose names appear on memorials at Police Headquarters in Bridgend, Cardiff Bay Police Station, and Swansea Central Police Station, together with others who lost their lives.

In undertaking the research, differences between the two world wars became apparent:

- 93 officers from the Glamorgan Constabulary, Cardiff City Police, Swansea Borough Police and Merthyr Tydfil Borough Police lost their lives as a result of service in the armed forces in the First World War. There were far fewer in the Second: 43 from Glamorgan, Cardiff, and Swansea.
- All of those who died during the First World War were regular police officers whereas in the Second there was a mixture of regular officers, war reserve constables, special constables, and civilian staff.

- Virtually all those in the first conflict died as a result of service in the army. In the Second World War the casualties were spread through the Royal Navy and Merchant Navy (3), the Army (15) and Royal Air Force (25). The preponderance of the latter reflects the importance of the latter reflects the importance of the war in the air and particularly in relation to the bombing campaigns against the enemy. Indeed, 16 of the 25 died whilst serving with Bomber Command.
- There are also geographical differences between the conflicts. The vast majority of those in the First World War died as a result of service in France and Belgium. Those from the Second are buried in graves and remembered on memorials throughout the world: in addition to the United Kingdom, they are found in Belgium, Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Malta, Malaysia, Myanmar (Burma), the Netherlands, Switzerland, the United States and Tunisia.
- Finally, in relation to these differences there is one which is particularly important, which is that, whilst there were some enemy air raids on the United Kingdom during the First World War, their extent during the Second was reflected in

the thousands of civilians who lost their lives and were injured during the devastation of places such as London, Coventry, and Plymouth. South Wales suffered too. Cardiff experienced heavy raids, and bombs were also dropped on Cwmparc in the Rhondda, causing loss of life and injury. Swansea endured many raids, the most severe of which took place on the nights of 19th, 20th, and 21st February 1941 ("the Three Nights' Blitz"), when over 600 people were killed or injured and the town centre was largely destroyed.

Police officers played their full part in civil defence. Two officers from the Swansea Borough Police were killed on duty during bombing and three died from the Glamorgan Police: two in the bombing of Cwmparc and one on the Gower Peninsula when a marine mine exploded. In Cardiff one officer was killed on duty as a result of enemy air raids. A further two off duty officers died and family members were also killed. In this Roll of Honour, we have recorded all of them alongside those who died on military service.

We mentioned earlier that this booklet contains brief details of those we are remembering. Our intention is to produce a further booklet in due course which will tell the individual stories more fully. In the meantime, we hope that this Roll of Honour will be a fitting tribute to those who died. They will not be forgotten.

CONSTABLE 107, CARDIFF CITY POLICE FLYING OFFICER (NAVIGATOR) 155386, 204 SQUADRON, COASTAL COMMAND

Born 9th November 1917 • Died 28th August 1944 Died when his aircraft crashed into the sea off West Africa in poor weather. Commemorated on the Malta Memorial.



EVANS, ALBERT JOHN

CONSTABLE 764, GLAMORGAN CONSTABULARY SERGEANT (AIR BOMBER) 1422223, NO 5 LANCASTER FINISHING SCHOOL, BOMBER COMMAND

Born 20th June 1919 • Died 12th January 1945 Died when his aircraft crashed in Nottinghamshire whilst on a night flying training exercise. Awarded the British Empire Medal for his actions during the German bombing of Cwmparc on 29th April 1941. Buried at the Oxford (Botley) Cemetery. (*Photo: John Evans/Helen Nall*)



GRAY, MYRDDIN

SPECIAL CONSTABLE, GLAMORGAN CONSTABULARY SERGEANT (AIR BOMBER) 1499067, 77 SQUADRON, BOMBER COMMAND

Born 24th March 1908 • Died 13th August 1943 Died when his aircraft was shot down over France whilst on a raid on Milan.

Buried at the communal cemetery at Verneuil-sur-Avre, France.

WAR RESERVE CONSTABLE, GLAMORGAN CONSTABULARY LEADING AIRCRAFTMAN 960724, 185 WING

Born 22nd September 1914 • Died 8th December 1941 Died of injuries sustained during a Japanese air raid on RAF Alor Star in Malaya. Buried at the Taiping War Cemetery in Malaysia.



HOPKINS, DANIEL

CONSTABLE 57, CARDIFF CITY POLICE SERGEANT (AIR BOMBER) 1317702, 101 SQUADRON, BOMBER COMMAND

Born 22nd September 1918 • Died 4th September 1943 Died when his aircraft was shot down over Berlin during a raid on the city.

Buried at the Berlin 1939-45 War Cemetery. (Photo: Claire Jenkins-Robinson)

Born 15th May 1910 • Died 3rd June 1943 Died of meningitis at the RAF hospital at Halton, near Aylesbury, Buckinghamshire.

Buried at the Aberdare Cemetery.

(Note 1: There are contradictions in the spelling of the surname in various documents between "Howell" and "Howells." However, the Glamorgan Police War Memorial, his death certificate and gravestone have it as "Howell").

(Note 2: The Glamorgan Police War Memorial gives his unit as the RAF Regiment but the Commonwealth War Graves Commission's Graves Registration Report gives it as No 11 Operational Training Unit which has been preferred here).



HUGHES, WILLIAM ARCHIE

CADET CLERK, SWANSEA BOROUGH POLICE FLYING OFFICER (PILOT) 170738, 251 SQUADRON, COASTAL COMMAND

Born 1st December 1920 • Died 17th March 1945 Died when the aircraft he was piloting was lost whilst on a meteorological patrol over the North Atlantic. Commemorated on the Air Forces Memorial at Runnymede in Surrey.



HYATT, VINCENT LONGMEAD

CONSTABLE (FIREMAN), CARDIFF CITY POLICE FIRE BRIGADE FLYING OFFICER (AIR BOMBER) 132394, 102 SQUADRON, BOMBER COMMAND

Born 19th March 1916 • Died 3rd October 1943 Died when his aircraft crashed near RAF Pocklington in Yorkshire whilst on a night cross country training flight. Buried at St James' Church, Bratton, in Wiltshire.

He is buried at the Becklingen War Cemetery in northern Germany. (Note: The Glamorgan Police War Memorial gives the surname as Johns as do other police records and military records. His birth certificate, however, and other records give it as John).



JOHNSON, CHARLES ALFRED

Born 13th December 1916 • Died 25th June 1943 Died when his aircraft was shot down off the Dutch coast whilst on a raid on the city of Wuppertal, in the Ruhr valley of Germany. Commemorated on the Air Forces Memorial at Runnymede. (Photo: South Wales Police Collection/West Glamorgan Archive Service)



JONES, DERRICK ISAAC

CONSTABLE 72, CARDIFF CITY POLICE FLYING OFFICER (NAVIGATOR/AIR BOMBER) I 20809, NO I OPERATIONAL TRAINING UNIT, COASTAL COMMAND

Born 19th October 1920 • Died 10th November 1942 Died when his aircraft crashed into high ground near Ullswater in the Lake District whilst on a night flying exercise. Buried at the Carmarthen Cemetery, Carmarthenshire.
